

Meet Rabbi Carnie Shalom Rose, the fifth Senior Rabbi in the 120+ year history of Congregation B'nai Amoona.

Rabbi Rose joins us after serving the last six years as Senior Rabbi at Old Westbury Hebrew Congregation of Long Island, New York. Since his ordination from the Conservative Movement's Jewish Theological Seminary of America in 1995, Rabbi Rose has served congregations in Columbus, Ohio and Tokyo, Japan.

Rabbi Rose earned his Bachelor's Degree in Comparative Religious Studies from the University of Winnipeg, where he was awarded the Terry Fox Humanitarian Award; a national merit scholarship granted to students who excel in the areas of academics, athletics and community service.

Rose has also completed graduate level course work in the field of Not-For-Profit Organizational Management at the University of Judaism in Los Angeles and Seton Hall University in South Orange, New Jersey.

He received an additional Bachelor's Degree in Hebrew Literature from the University of Judaism and a Master's Degree in Talmud and Rabbinics from the Jewish Theological Seminary of America in New York. Rabbi Rose is currently pursuing a Doctor of Jewish Studies Degree at the Spertus Institute of Jewish Studies in Chicago.

Rabbi Rose was born in New York, but grew up in Winnipeg, Manitoba, Canada & Jerusalem, Israel. He is the son of Rabbi Neal & Carol Rose of Winnipeg and is married to Pauline - herself a graduate of the Graduate School of Education of the Jewish Theological Seminary. Rabbi & Paulie have four children - Noa (7), Zakai (3), Lev (3), and Ellior (1).

Rabbi Rose is deeply committed to making Judaism "come alive" - both spiritually & intellectually. He is dedicated to promulgating a religious path filled with *Hitlahavut* - zeal, passion and exuberance.
